On the Job Training Program

Participation in Columbia College's Forestry and Conservation On the Job Training (OJT) program will include 288 hours of related supplemental instruction (RSI) at the college while working a minimum of 2000 hours of paid on-the-job training (OJT) with one of our Industry Partners. In addition to a Certificate of Achievement in the Management & Restoration of Fire-Adapted Ecosystems with Columbia College. Once complete, students will be eligible to receive certification as a registered trainee for the State of California as a Forest and Conservation Technician.
